re presently have the names of 977 AMTs/IMTs worldwide which includes 105 deceased members and 163 that are AMTA voting members. We have information for 416 individuals in the database that we have been unable to keep current. We have at least 30 incorrect email addresses and over 333 AMTs with no contact information other than a name. We have 50 or more with limited information and 38 of the 50 individuals we contacted have not provided any information for the AMTA database. Please be aware that the AMTA is extremely careful about protecting everyone's personal data and will not release it without that persons authorization.

I have had wonderful help locating AMTs and keeping the personal data up to date. From my monthly email list of lost AMTs, one individual has updated and verified over 20 AMTs' email addresses. I thank everyone that provides information, no matter how insignificant you think it may be. It could help find a "lost" AMT. Thank you for your help.

Many people do not know about the AMTA, therefore, we need your help in promoting AMTA membership. As we find friends from the past, we need help spreading the word about the AMTA and inviting those who are to become members of what I consider an

outstanding organization. I am sure many people out there (that I do not know or have not been with) have said, "Who is Tom Joines and the AMTA?" You as a personal friend and fellow AMT can help by contacting them. If you do not have their information, call or send an email to someone on the board of directors or to me so we can assist you in contacting the person. The more active you are as an AMTA member, the stronger the organization will become.

The AMTA stands for a lot more than just great reunions and fellowship. I found an AMT last week that had been through a tornado, lost everything, including his military orders/papers. He had been at the 6988th.When I found him, he was out helping others that had just gone through a tornado. When he is ready, we will try to help him locate what he needs. We also send money yearly to the Enlisted Widows Home, and we help our comrades in difficult situations, such as Katrina. It helps us grow into a stronger, close-knit not-for-profit organization.

CHAPLAIN's CORNER.

n these troubling times I've been wondering what to share with all my friends and the AMTA. Perhaps this tract I came across will help someone to think about having the peace of God through trusting in Jesus the Christ.

LABELS: Labels are handy. They help us keep track of things, tell us how much things cost, warn us, and instruct us.

Sometimes we label people. Many people are called Democrats or Republicans. A person may have the label "Success" if he has made a lot of money.

A vague, but often used label is "Christian." Most people when asked, "Are you a Christian?" find it easy to answer, "Yes." That's because this label includes:

HEREDITARY CHRISTIANS: People whose parents were Christians and who think they are also.

ETHICAL CHRISTIANS: People who are good. They don't break the law and they try to live by the Golden Rule

The highly-modified Boeing C-135 Stratolifter has the ability to exploit an electronic battlefield and deliver near-real-time intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance information to tactical forces, combatant commanders and national command authorities. The Air Force Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Agency, and its predecessor organizations, have manned this reconnaissance platform since its inception.
