AMTA VSO INFORMATION

Free Access Pass for US National Parks

pring flowers are blooming, the summer travel season quickly approaches and Veterans are joining the 330-million yearly visitors enjoying U.S. National Parks.

AMT's/ASE's, with a service connected disability rating of 10% or higher, are entering Federal parks for free with the Lifetime National Parks Access Pass from the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service. Good for entry into 400+ National Parks and over 2,000 recreation sites across the country, the Lifetime Access Pass is another way a grateful nation says thank you for the service and sacrifices of Veterans with disabilities.

The Access Pass admits disabled Veterans and any passengers in their vehicle (non-commercial) at per-vehicle fee areas; and, the pass owner plus three additional adults where per-person fees are charged. In addition to free entry at participating parks, the Access Pass includes discounts on expanded amenity fees; such as camping, swimming, boat launching and guided tours. There are two ways to apply.

First, disabled Veterans can apply in person at a participating federal recreation site. Simply present photo identification (Driver's license, State ID, Passport) and documentation proving a permanent disability (VA awards letter, VA ID with service connected annotation, VA sum-

mary of benefits, or receipt of Social Security disability income). That's It. The Pass is free and issued at the time of entry.

Second, if applying by mail, send a completed packet and \$10 processing fee to the United States Geological Survey (USGS). The packet should include:

*The Access Pass application form *Proof of residency

*VA disability award letter, VA summary of benefits, or proof of SSDI income Pass delivery expected 10-12 weeks after receipt.

Make sure to have photo ID available when using your Lifetime Access Pass and enjoy the majestic scenery and abundant recreational opportunities our National Parks provide.

AMTA'S FACEBOOK GROUP LOSS OF AN AMT

Loss Notification Process

his year has been pretty rough for many of us. We have lost friends, people we know, and family. Some lost to accidents and some due to illness or aging. We know that our life here on Earth is temporary at best.

The losses we have had create problems for those left behind. Usually when a friend or someone we know or a family member passes only a few people know about it.

When someone passes away those within the Airborne Maintenance Technician Association (AMTA) would like to know about it for various reasons. The deceased may be an AMTA member. Secondly even if they are not an AMTA member most likely they are dear to someone associated with the AMTA, which makes them part of the AMTA family and special to all of us within the AMTA. Many people wish to remain private during a time of loss, and that must be respected in every situation. We post nothing on the AMTA website or the AMTA FaceBook group about someone's loss of a dear friend or relative unless the family requests it. Our biggest problem over the past few years is someone will pass away and no one other than the immediate family is aware of the loss. If we do not know within the AMTA we continue searching for the person. It becomes rather embarrassing when you continue to search for someone only to find out they passed away two years ago, six months ago or whatever. In addition to being embarrassing it leaves a very sad an empty feeling within the AMTA especially if it was an AMTA member or an AMTA family member.

Some suggestions that may prevent this from happening so often: First contact the AMTA Board of Directors, a link is in the left border on every page of the AMTA website to email the Board of Directors. This will ensure the membership records and information are corrected. The Board of Directors will share applicable dates and locations of anything concerning the deceased. The Board shares this information with the AMTA membership. If the family does not want anything shared with anyone including the AMTA membership it will not be shared. Everything posted on the AMTA FaceBook group is placed there for public viewing. Even though the AMTA Group is closed it does not prevent others from sharing information that is posted on the group.

Another person that can be contacted is the AMTA FaceBook Group moderator as he will act and treat everything in the same manner as the AMTA Board.

AMTA membership is located all over the World, and we care about each other and would like to know when a friend or family member passes away. This is because we care. Bottom line.....Please inform someone within the AMTA when an AMT or friend or family member passes so that we may show our respect for them.
