Maintenance Technicians (AMT/IMT/
ASE) FaceBook Group

This is the first WireBender article about our Airborne Maintenance and In-flight Maintenance Technicians (AMT/IMT/ASE) FaceBook group. The AMTA FB group is a private group. Which means only members can see who's in the group and what they post. And, non-members can not post to the AMTA FB Group webpage. To be accepted into the group a person has to have actually performed duties as an AMT at sometime in the past. Membership is by application only, persons wishing to join have to apply for membership and provide verifiable evidence that they have actually performed as an airborne maintenance technician. Applications to join the group must be approved by the AMTA FaceBook administrator.

The FaceBook group currently has 245 members. Some of those members are members of the AMTA. But, many of the members of the AMTA FB Group are not members of the Airborne Maintenance Technician Association.

If you are a member of the AMTA FB Group, but are not a member of the AMTA, I would encourage you to join and support the AMTA, as it is a great way to fellowship and take part in an association that does a lot to help others. 
